Under Ordinance 71 Section 2.060 C3 "Person in possession, charge or control of the Premises shall be liable to the District for the District's cost to replace the Container. However, if the GM reasonably determines that the need to repair or replace the Container is due to abuse, misuse, or neglect of the Container by an Owner or Occupant of the Premises, the Owner, Occupant or Person in possession, charge or control of the Premises shall be liable to the District for the District's cost to repair or replace the Container".

# **BOARD CONCERNS/COMMENTS**

# **GENERAL COUNSEL CONCERNS/COMMENTS**

General Counsel J. Eggart informed the Board of Senate Bill No. 54 that was approved by California Governor Newsom on June 30, 2022. The bill will create an Extended Producer Responsibility Program (EPR) for printed paper and plastic packaging, require certain reductions and eliminations in single-use plastic packaging, promote reuse or refill systems and implement eco-modulated fees and environmental justice provisions. It also will require all plastic packaging in the state to reach a 30% recycling rate by 2028, increasing to 65% by 2032.

General Counsel J. Eggart convened the meeting to closed session at 5:53 P.M. pursuant to Government Code Section 54957(b)(1) as identified on the agenda as Item 14A.
